The Class of 2024 have received their National Senior Certificate results, a testimony to their extraordinary efforts. When we celebrated our 150th year in 2024, we resolved to undertake a VISION of CELEBRATION and FUTURE LEGACY, with a year of celebration of all that Collegiate is, of all who have been through the School, of all its achievements, of friendships and connections; and a year of looking to the FUTURE through the legacy we create and leave for the future. We commend the Class of 2024 on giving us another reason to celebrate and on the legacy that they have created. It is with great pride that we announce that we have attained a 100% pass rate for the tenth consecutive year. There were 130 Collegiate candidates who wrote the examinations and 98.5% qualified for degree courses and 1.5% qualified for diploma courses. In addition to impressive NSC results, Collegiate had a number of learners enrolled for the IEB Further Studies Mathematics and English programmes. We could not have asked for a brighter end to our year of celebrating 150 years of excellence than seeing our Class of 2024 celebrating today as they collected their results.

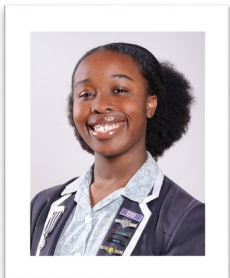
In addition, her average for all seven subjects was an impressive 92%.

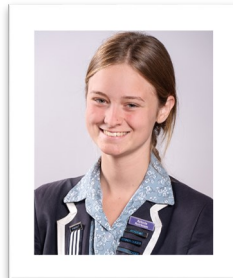

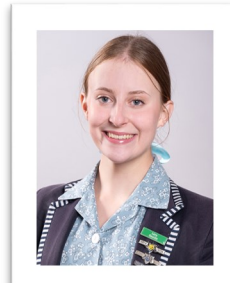
